CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- He welcomed Public Works Director Galovale "Nalo" Galovale.
- Nalo Galovale introduced himself as an Engineer with ten years of public sector experience. He is looking forward to assisting with the construction of the waste water treatment plant and other projects.
- Rex Allen Days was a success and he thanked everyone, including staff, for all their work.
- He noted that the Cowboy Hall of Fame was a great success and is a special time to honor and remember those involved in ranching.
- He and Mayor Irvin attended the Sulphur Springs Valley Electric Company (SSVEC) community leader dinner.

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- He attended the Northern Cochise Fund Grants Award celebration.
- He mentioned that Western Bank celebrated their 5th year anniversary and he thanked them for their service.
- The City received a \$10,000 grant for the skateboard park. The City has some money left over from Phase I and that will added to Phase II.
- He mentioned that the Historic Preservation Advisory Committee has approved the roof design for the Mascot railcar. Low bid came in at \$24,600. Funds have been budgeted. This will be paid for with railroad revenues received in 2007 for this purpose. We will proceed with getting the structure in place.
- He gave an update on the waste water treatment plant. The approval of the construction management contract will be on the next meeting agenda.
- He gave an update on CDBG paperwork. The City is in the tail end of the latest comment period. The various property owners are being asked to do some clean-up as this will help keep the cost down on the use of CDBG funds. The next step in this process is to hire a firm to see if there is any asbestos or lead. If any is detected, a firm will be contracted to remove it. If the removal costs are too great, the City will have to prioritize which projects will be completed.
- The City is working on updating its plans for road repair work. The goal is to make sure the plans keep up with street maintenance.
