- 3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG-Mayor Lindsey
- 4. CALL TO THE PUBLIC-Justice of the Peace Trevor Ward, Precinct #4 reported on the status of Justice Courts. At the end of evening he will respond to any questions under the City Manager Reports. Status figures are from January to December 2008 and include when his Court took over of our Magistrate Court on July 1, 2008. He also reported that the Willcox Court had over \$1 Million in uncollected fines. A collection agency was hired and they sent to them the files and they send letters out and if no response they will put a hold on their State Tax Returns; hold on registration of vehicle and they are averaging \$12,000 month. The County Court Budget has to cut 8% this year and another 5% next year or 13% cut and of his budget 90% is wages. Judge Ward has been told to cut 10% by June 2010, although, he is not sure how he is going to do it. Does not want to take away from Clerks for the work they do.

Consideration, discussion and/or decision regarding the following topics by the City Manager:

- Skate Park Meeting Update-Mr. Bonner reported he met with Paul Sheets and Sally Van Haren today and the amount of money is \$15,000 and asked what is next step? Going to do bid specs and get that project underway and if have to peel some things down we can. Concrete and chain link fence longer than concrete area. Next meeting is on March 18 at Public Works building at 11:00 a.m. Councilman Johnson said the bid on concrete specs talked about going to ask for donation and Mr. McCourt replied look to maximize area we can get. Mayor Lindsey stated since we waited so long he asked if Skate Committee has come up with more money. Mr. Sheets replied last he heard was \$2500 from Chamber and the kids thinking until see action do they want to continue doing this. Mr. Sheets thinks today's meeting was great progress.
- Airport Ad Hoc Advisory Committee Organizational meeting Wednesday, March 4, 2009 at 6:00 p.m., here in this room to select Chairman, Vice Chairman and set a meeting date.
- Library Update-Library Director Tom Miner reported they are still moving forward. Received formal proposal for Architectural design Friday and he, Mr. Bonner and Mr. McCourt are finalizing this. They are meeting tomorrow afternoon in more detail. After that then it will be brought to the Mayor and Council for approval.
- **Report on the Contract with JP Court –** started in July 2008 and heard report earlier. Pleased how progressing and contract ends on June 30, and asked do we want to extend the contract.
- Report on Crack Seal Project on Ft. Grant Road- Mr. Bonner reported amount approved \$20,000 and received invoice for \$5,500 and another invoice should be coming because following weekend they worked and anticipates it will be less than he asked for. The item was approved on Monday and the County started work on Friday.
- Report on the Asbestos at the old Police Building-151 W. Maley, preliminary steps. Building Inspector Jeff Stoddard reported asbestos survey was done last week and this week after he knows what it entails he will go out to bid.
- **Smart Growth Update-**state requirements. Mr. Stoddard has submitted to State the Smart Growth Committee. Ms. Green contacted him last week and it should be on their web site we have completed it.
- Invitation First Things First- working with Cochise County \$1.9M presenting check for Early Childhood Development in Sierra Vista on Friday, March 6. City not directly receiving funds and anyone interested contact the City Clerk Christy Whelan.
- Long term water supply-we are dumping some water this week and Mr. Bonner reported beginning tomorrow morning we have to start conducting a 48 hour draw test on Well. Consists of 48 hours of continuous operation of Well #2. The water in the tank will be reduced to level of 5'6" or 250,000 gallons. If any problems the Well will come on. Need to get aquifer to rest and starts at 8:00 a.m. Will begin watering park, hydrants running in that area, Middle School and Keiller Park and Quail Park will be primary areas. Staff will be flushing fire hydrants at the end of Rex Allen, Jr. Road by the Golf Course.
- **Received email Gabrille Gifford-**teleconference in Sierra Vista, and received invitation to attend on Thursday. There is limited seating contact him tomorrow immediately if not contact City Clerk Whelan.
- Welcomed them to St. Patrick's month and keeping with the green spirit.
- **Counsel Justice Court**-consolidation best move City did. Received information where we were, where we came from and where we are. Thanked Judge Ward who personally participated and had a hand in this consolidation

and thanked him. Judge Ward stated he has a great staff and he has been asked to cut 10% wages and said "no way" and he has suggested taking it out of his wages.

All Council members need to look at that date and adjust calendar and try to attend. Lots of information particularly with economic condition and feels we will get information and direction from that meeting that will be critical for Council.

Vice Mayor Schultz thanked Judge Ward cooperation and he does a great job. To Mr. McCourt he said he sees him everywhere and attends many meetings around town and thinks they did a good selection and thinks staff appreciates what he does. Bo Downey thanked the Mayor and Council for indulging him on Railroad Avenue and stated he looks forward to promoting Willcox.
