The new Solarium is rapidly taking its place as part of the Library. There is finally enough money in contributions from the community and matching money from the City coffers to actually build some of the Skate Park.

Despite glacially slow improvement, the economy is showing some signs that people are getting back to work.

I thought that the General Fund of the City would break even by June 30th 2011; looks like we will make it by June 30, 2012. Your Used Christmas Tree

When you are finished with your Christmas tree (assuming you did not buy a live tree for replanting or have a reusable tree) you may disposal of the tree by taking it to the City's "Green Site". The Green Site is located near the Golf Course; take Rex Allen Jr. Drive toward the Golf course; just before the Driving Range, turn right on the dirt road; about a ¼ mile on the left is a large area for green waste (not for garbage, old sofas, concrete, or lumber). If you leave your tree there the City will mulch it up. The mulch is free to anyone who would like to pick it up and use it. If you have a hard time getting to the Green Site, **for Christmas only**, you can drop off your used Christmas tree across the street from the Public Works yard on the railroad frontage at Delos and Railroad Ave. Please have a Safe and Happy Holiday Season.

The Mascot & Western Rail Car

As most people have noticed, the Mascot and Western Railroad Car located on Railroad Avenue across from City Hall, has been undergoing renovation. What is not so well known is that the renovation is being performed by volunteers.

To date: the old rotted outside wood has been removed; the necessary copper sheeting has been removed; and the old rotted windows have been removed. New wood to match the historical style has been installed and primed, and the windows have been reconstructed. So far, the bulk of the work has been done by John Cropper, Linda Drew, and Dave Bonner; also participating were: Monika Cronberg, Connie Bonner, Pat Sheehe, Loretta Seidel, Aurora Seidel, Jeff Stoddard, and Pat McCourt.

If you would like to help, the next work day is Saturday, December 31, 2011, starting at 8 AM. We will be placing the new windows back in the frames and painting them with primer. You are welcome to join us in this community project; no particular skills are necessary (although construction skills are appreciated).

Future plans call for the repainting of the entire Rail Car, building a platform in front to allow access to look in the windows, and building a roof over the entire rail car to protect it from the weather.

Union Pacific Railroad Foundation has also provided a Grant to assist in paying for the renovation.
