QUIET ZONE: A quiet zone was established along the three (3) city crossings, so please be extra careful when you are traveling or visiting those areas. The train conductor may still blow their horn if they feel an unsafe condition. Anyone walking with headphones in an area marked as a “Quiet Zone” or “No Horn Zone” should remove their head phones to listen for the possibility of an oncoming train. If we all work together, this zone will remain in effect and address the 80 times a day or so that the train horns were blowing.

CHIP SEAL PROJECT: We are in the process of completing this year’s chip seal projects. The chip seal is the most feasible way the city can try to maintain a minimum level of repairs with funds availability. Please respect the employees in these zones and drive with extreme caution, and their focus will be on the “business at hand.” The employees are doing as instructed and all vehicles must be removed from that street’s rights-of-way before they can complete the task at hand. Your cooperation is appreciated.

POOL OPENING: The pool will be open on May 25th, 2015 for the public. Swim lessons will be June 9-19 or July 7-17, of which signing up will open the first day of the pool opening. Sign-Ups are taken on a first come, first serve basis. As a reminder, the pool is open Tuesday – Sunday from 1 through 6 pm. There is morning adult swimming and some evening swimming also.
